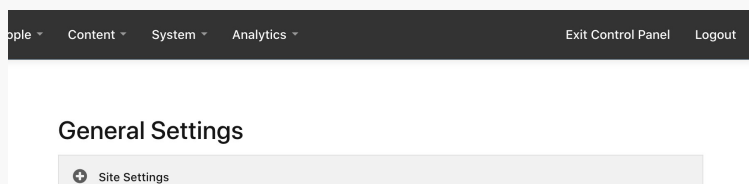
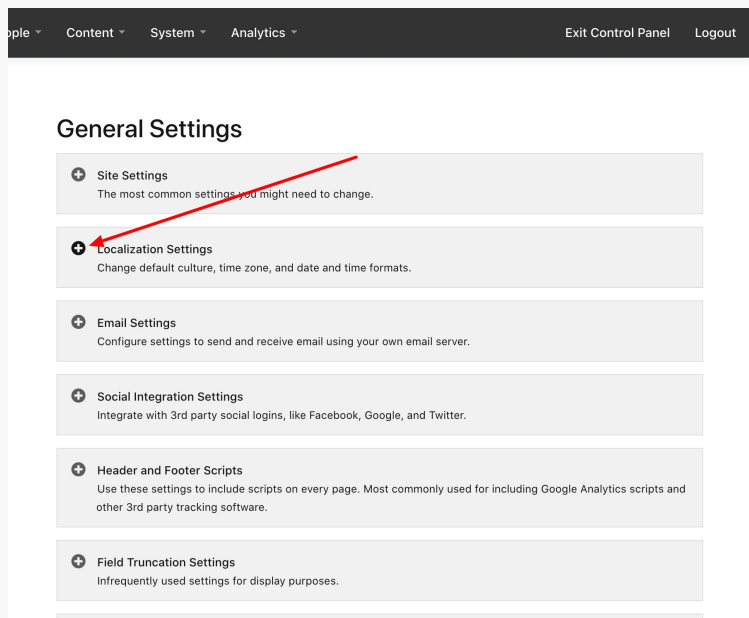
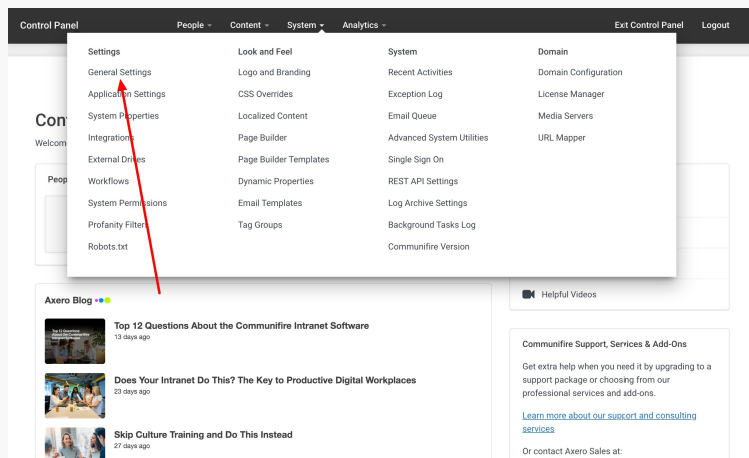

Localization settings include default culture, time zone, and date and time formats.



The most common settings you might need to change.

Localization Settings
Change default culture, time zone, and date and time formats.

Culture	en-US (English) Convert Resources for additional culture options.
Time zone	(UTC-07:00) Mountain Time (US & Ca)
Date format	M/d/yyyy (4/13/2021)
Time format	h:mm tt (2:25 PM)
Date display style	Short Date Only (03/11/2011)

Email Settings
Configure settings to send and receive email using your own email server.

- Time zone, date format, and time format settings can be overridden by people's own settings.
 - For an individual to set their own time zone, they'll click into Personal Settings > Preferences > Select the different time zone and > Save.
- Date display styles:
 - Short Date Only (03/11/2011)
 - Short Date plus Time (03/11/2011 02:25 PM)
 - Mixed Mode: Displays "12 hours ago", "26 days ago" etc when date is less than 30 days, otherwise displays date in short date format
 - Mixed Mode with Time: Displays "12 hours ago", "26 days ago" etc when date is less than 30 days, otherwise displays date in short date format along with time

Click **Save System Settings** to save settings.

[Localized Content](#) allows you to translate or replace static text used in the Communifire user interface with the text of your choice. You can change the default terminology used in the user interface to match the terminology that best suits your company or organization. For example, you might change *Spaces* to *Teams*, *Connections* to *Friends*, or *People* to *Co-workers*.
