Using URL mappings, you can create URL redirects. As an example, if you deleted an article, but you have linked this article in many places, you could create a URL mapping to redirect the old URL to a new URL. If you have a public intranet, this also helps Google know where to redirect users.

Add URL Mapping

1. Click the gear icon > **Control Panel** > **System** > **URL Mapper**.
2. Click **Add URL Mapper**.
3. Enter the **Old URL**.
4. Enter the **New URL** to redirect to.
5. Select the **Redirect Type**. Usually **301**.
6. Check **Is Active** to enable the redirect immediately.
7. Click **Save**.

Edit URL Mapping

1. Click the gear icon > **Control Panel** > **System** > **URL Mapper**.
2. For a mapping, click the edit icon.
3. Make changes to the mapping.
4. Click **Update**.

Delete URL Mapping

Delete URL Mapping

1. Click the gear icon > **Control Panel** > **System** > **URL Mapper**.
2. Check mappings.
3. Click **Delete**.
4. Click **OK**.
