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## What is Content Security Policy?

Content Security Policy (CSP) is a security setting that sets the external sites your site can load resources from. If a resource comes from a site that isn't in the CSP whitelist, that resource is blocked.

CSP protects against content injection attacks, such as Cross-Site Scripting (XSS). CSP allows administrators to reduce the risk of attacks on their site by specifying a whitelist of trusted sites that resources can be loaded from.
